Old Blue & Yeller

This makes a 12" block!




** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **




Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 5" x 15" strip into twelve 2-1/2" squares...




Next mark and cut the Color 2 5" x 17" strip into four 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles...



Next speed piece the half squares, by stacking the Color 1 and Color 2 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strips, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top strip, lightly mark the 2-7/8" square lines and mark the diagonals in the direction shown at left. Now sew 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square lines. Now cut apart ON the marked diagonals, and on the 2-7/8" square lines. This will give you eight half squares. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabric. These should measure 2-1/2"...



Lay out squares and half squares as shown at far left. Sew five horizontal rows, and then join those rows to make the block's center unit. Press seams in alternating directions by row...



Now piece the block. Sew two Color 1 squares to the ends of two Color 2 rectangles. These will be the block's top and bottom rows. Press seams to darker sides. Sew the remaining two Color 2 rectangles to the block's center unit. Join these rows and there's the completed block! ...on to Page 2!

Community Service Committee (CSC)

It is important that we keep track of donation quilts. To help facilitate the process, we ask that all members submit their completed quilts along with the donation slip(s) at the monthly meetings. Donation slips can be found at the membership table near where you sign in. Also, we all enjoy seeing your donation quilts at Show and Tell. There will be a tote marked Community Service available to place your quilts once you have shown your creation to the membership. The CSC will be responsible for the delivery of such quilts. Please be sure to designate on the donation slip if you wish to designate your quilt to a particular charity.

If you want to designate your quilt, below is information on some categories. Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal Units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated). Preemie guilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cotton or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for quilts using flannel. No tied quilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. We have been told the quiet darker environment of a covered isolette helps the babies sleep and grow better.

Quilts of Valor: Contact Kathy Cosand and Gail Olney for details. The recommended size is 60" x 80"; it must be a minimum of 55" x 65" and maximum of 72" x 90".

Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts: Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long.

Ada Carey Women's and Children's Shelter—Will accept any size up to 50x65 (throw size). Any size from a small quilt to wrap their upper body in up to a throw size. Children's guilts do not have to be fancy. Please make them in bright, child appropriate fabrics. They will be dragged around, machine washing and loved to pieces. Quilts for women as well as children appreciated. They often come in with nothing and giving them something of their own to snuggle in is so appreciated. These quilts should have no label.

If you donate an undesignated quilt, we will find homes for any size you make. Twin and larger size quilts can be used for various charities we support as well as disaster relief.

Please remember to save your HOBBS BATTING UPC labels from your batting packages. Our guild can order batting for charity projects at a discounted price through their facility in Waco.

GRANBURY QUILTERS' QUILT GUILD BY-LAWS

Article I NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Granbury Quilters' Quilt Guild, hereafter referred to in this document as The Guild.

Article IV DUES STRUCTURE

Section 3: Payment of yearly membership dues for all renewing members shall be required no later than the January meeting of each year.

Section 2: The 1st Vice President

d. Shall be responsible for maintaining the Guild Fixed Asset Catalog.

d. Shall be responsible for organizing and making

arrangements for the monthly programs and workshops from March of the elected year

through February of the following year.

- Workshops will be primarily for members.
 Guests will be charged a non-member fee, and any profits will be placed into the Program/Workshop budget for that fiscal year. (See Standing Rule #10)
- 2. Shall submit to the board any requests for Programs or workshops that extend beyond February of the following year.
- Shall submit program and workshop Information to the Newsletter chair each month.

Section 3: The 2nd Vice President

- a. Shall preside in the absence of the President and the 1st Vice President during the elected year.
- b. Shall be responsible for organizing and making arrangements for the monthly programs and workshops from March of the elected year through February of the following year.
 - Workshops will be primarily for members. Guests will be charged a non-member fee, and any profits will be placed into the Program/Workshop budget for that fiscal year. (See Standing Rule #10)
 - Shall submit to the board any requests for programs or workshops that extend beyond February of the following year.
 - Shall submit program and workshop information to the Newsletter and Publicity chair each month.
 - 4. Shall submit the new year's programs and workshops to the membership chair for publication in the membership book.
- b. Shadows 1st Vice President during her first year and set up programs and workshops.

- c. Shall take over 1st Vice President's responsibilities in her absence.
- d. Will step up in second year as 1st Vice President.

Article VIII MEETINGS

Section 2: Regular Meetings

- c. The agenda shall be in the following order:
 - 1. Approval of Minutes
 - 2. Reports of officers and any standing committee
 - 3. Reports of special committees
 - 4. Unfinished business
 - 5. New business
 - 6. Show and Tell
 - 7. D
 - 7. Program

Article IX STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 5: Fund Raising Committee

- a. Shall be responsible for the planning of any fund raising activities other than the Quilt Show.
- b. Shall turn over monies collected to the Treasurer.
- c. Shall maintain accurate records necessary for payment of any state sales tax.
- d. Shall follow the directions listed in Article XIV, Non Profit Status 501c (3) for Guild fundraising.

Section 6: Historian

- a. Shall be responsible for keeping a historical book of the Guild including newsletters, news clippings, correspondence, and other notices concerning the Guild.
- Shall be custodian of Guild historical Books.

Section 8: Membership Committee

- e. Shall compile the Membership Book and distribute it to the general membership no later than March of each year.
- Shall compile a membership record (form to be decided by the Board) and distribute it to the general membership.

Section 9: Newsletter

c. Shall provide a copy of the monthly newsletter to the Historian.

Section 11: Quilt Show Committee

- a. Shall consist of two co-chairpersons appointed by the incoming president in January of the year prior to the Quilt Show.
- b. Co-chairpersons shall serve for two years (preceding and year of quilt show).
- Section 13: Show and Tell
 - b. Shall designate a person to take pictures if Historian is not present.
 - Shall submit names and items to Newsletter Chair each month.

Section 15: Webmaster

a. Shall be in charge of the Blog and website.

Article XI NON-VOTING LIAISON COMMITTEES

- Section 1: TAQG Representative (Texas Association of Quilters Guild: A non-governing resource community.)
 - Shall be appointed by the President as a non-voting member of the Board.
 - Shall attend the TAQG scheduled meetings and serve as a liaison between the Guild and TAQG bringing information, i.e. updates, area quilt shows, helpful resources, back to the Guild.
 - c. Shall serve as Guild Coordinator for TAQG Rally Day activities.
 - d. Shall be reimbursed for travel expenses for scheduled TAQG meetings. (See Standing Rule #13)

Section 2: Bee Keeper

- a. Shall be appointed by the President as a non-voting member of the Board.
- b. Shall be responsible to know and record all bees in the Guild that choose to be recorded, their contact and alternate contact persons, current meeting days, locations and whether they are open to new members.
- c. Shall be responsible keeping guild members informed of a bee.
- d. Membership in the Guild is not required to be a member of a bee.

GRANBURY QUILTERS' QUILT GUILD STANDING RULES

4. A member will be eligible to win a Block of the Month once per calendar year.

13. TAQG Representative will be reimbursed for mileage only to regularly scheduled TAQG meetings.
